NASTASSJA SIMENSKY

Nastassja Simensky is an artist, PhD researcher and lecturer who often works collaboratively to make writing, place-specific performances, events, sound work and films as a form of ongoing fieldwork.

MARK PRINA

Mark Prina is from A Rocha, a Christian charity working for the protection and restoration of the natural world and committed to equipping Christians and churches in the UK to care for the environment. He is the reserve manager for Foxearth Meadows, which is A Rocha UK's rural nature reserve, comprising 11 and a half acres of wetland on the River Stour floodplain in north Essex. He will be speaking and also announcing the start of our joining in their Partners in Action programme.

BEN NIBLETT

Ben Niblett is from Tearfund and is a senior associate in the Global Advocacy Team. He will be speaking about the work that Tearfund are involved with to take action on the Climate Crisis. One of the resources that Tearfund provides for to help churches and organisations is a Climate Emergency Toolkit, a route map to help all members respond to the climate emergency with simple but powerful actions that will have an impact far beyond your own walls.

SEEOG

South East Essex Organic Gardeners are a web fed by and feeding those concerned with the ecology of our planet and our human impact on it. SEEOG aim to promote the organic way and a community response and reaction to develop resilience locally and globally. SEEOG meet every two months with talks on a wide range of topics, usually with a local connection; we also provide speakers for other organisations to help spread the word.

SOUTHEND IN TRANSITION

Southend in Transition is a group exploring how the people of the borough of Southend on Sea can prepare for a carbon constrained, energy lean world. SiT is a community-led initiative which is working towards the creation of an Energy Descent Action Plan for the town.

EXTINCTION REBELLION

Extinction Rebellion is an international movement that uses non-violent civil disobedience in an attempt to halt mass extinction and minimise the risk of social collapse. Extinction Rebellion have a vision of change: Creating a world that is fit for generations to come.

REPAIR CAFES

A Repair Café is a place where people gather to work on repairing objects of everyday life such as electrical devices, bicycles, clothing, and other items. A Repair Café is a form of grassroots movement that aims to reduce waste, overconsumption, and planned obsolescence.

RACHEL SUMMERS

Rachel is a forest school practitioner based in East London. She loves exploring nature with humans of all ages, and her hands are never quite mud free.

SPEAKER & ORGANISATION BIOGRAPHIES

THE OTHONA COMMUNITY

The Othona Community was established in 1946 to promote peace and reconciliation after WWII. It continues to be a place where people explore community, faith and sustainability.

Othona is an off-grid community so we have to generate all our electricity. At the moment we use a combination of solar panels, a wind turbine and a diesel generator. We are hoping to build a new bigger wind turbine to minimise our use of diesel. Space and water heating uses a biomass generator. There will be an opportunity during the weekend for a tour and discussion of our energy systems.

TRUST LINKS

Trust Links is your local mental health and wellbeing charity. We work across South Essex to support people experiencing mental health difficulties, families and other community members. Our projects support over 1,500 people a year, with main bases in Southend, Rochford and Castle Point. We're committed to building stronger communities and transforming lives.

Supporting the environment through sustainable living is at the core of our work. Each of the Trust Links sites feature environmentally beneficial features including green roofs, heating systems, insect habitats, composting toilets and more. Through our Eco Days project we have worked to engage the local community with leading a more sustainable lifestyle.
